IS YOUR DOG READY FOR SERVICE DOG TRAINING?

General checklist for adult dogs. This list is similar to what we might also look for with puppies, acknowledging development stages.



BASELINE TEMPERAMENT

- Dog does not react strongly to a stranger entering their space.
- Dog can be left with a known person (not handler) for brief periods of time without vocalizing, pacing, etc.
- Dog can easily trade a toy or bone without any conflict
- Dog can take food in at least 3 new locations.
- Dog does not strongly react to startles, loud noises, or strange floor textures.

OUT AND ABOUT

- Currently walk dog in areas outside of the house.
- Dog and handler have been in petfriendly stores together.
- Handler understands basic expectations of Service Dog laws and when Service Dogs can be questions or removed from public.
- Handler has support system of at least 2 individuals to discuss disability or service dog training with.
- Handler can identify when they AND their dog might need a break from training or outing.

HANDLING AND GROOMING

- Dog is able to accept calm petting from a stranger.
- Dog and handler can work through greetings strangers in public.
- O Dog can tolerate nail trims on a weekly basis
- O Dog is okay with weekly brushing
- O Dog is bathed every other month
- Dog is free of any big health concerns either physical or mental/emotional.
- Dog is comfortable with various gear (leash, collar, harness, raincoat, etc.

OBEDIENCE SKILLS

- Dog walks on a loose leash for at least
 15seconds
- Dog can stay in position for 30seconds
- Dog understands sit and down cue without physical pressure.
- Dog can walk past a strange dog at least 15 feet away.
